ACADEMIC/BEHAVIORIAL EVALUATION

Each year, as a student's IEP Annual Review date approaches, it is important to assess and evaluate his/her progress during the IEP year. To that end, we at Britten are committed to providing parents/guardians and home school districts with the most current data results possible. Evaluating both academic and behavioral progress enables Britten faculty to construct the most appropriate goals for each student based on individualized performance results.

A behavioral evaluation called the Behavioral Assessment System for Children (BASC-3) is completed for all students ages 6 through 21. The Beck Youth Inventories provides a comprehensive evaluation of the youth current level of distress. The areas measured are depression, anxiety, disruptive behavior, anger and self-concept. The Social Academic Emotional Behavior Risk Assessment Screener (SAEBRS) is a universal screening of a student's risk for social-emotional and behavioral problems in grades K through 12. Academic testing is also administered to all students. Students of the ages 6 through 21 are evaluated using the Kaufman Test of Educational Achievement (KTEA-Brief 3) and FastBridge. Results of these assessments will be presented to the parent/guardian at a formal meeting during the academic school year.

Parental support is critical in ensuring that students receive the most appropriate and individualized services available to them.
